Dear Parents

Currently our overall % attendance for the year is 95% which is already below our target of 96%. This will be the second year running that we have not reached our target. This is causing the school difficulties with the local authority and potentially could with OFSTED as attendance can have a direct affect on the outcome of an inspection.

The most troubling part of our attendance patterns at Shillington however is that we are increasingly made aware of some families who are taking term time holidays but phoning their children in sick. This is dishonest and where we are made aware that this is the case, then the absence will still be classed as unauthorised term time holiday and could possibly be referred for a fixed penalty notice. Children when they've been on holiday are excited to share the news with their friends and adults in school. They should be able to share exciting things that have happened to them. We do want our children to grow up with a strong set of morals and values. If you are taking a holiday - just tell us that. The absence can then be recorded accurately.

Can I just take this opportunity to thank everybody who is supporting our attendance policy and understands the importance of good attendance.
